I don't know about you, but I'm often stumped by the science questions my kids throw at me. I have no trouble helping them with spelling, or simple arithmetic, or even state capitals ... but when it comes to explaining why teeth chatter, or how roosters know what time it is -- I guess I'm not as well-educated as I should be!

And yet our children are growing up into a world that is more technological than ever ...

... a world where familiarity with computers is becoming essential, not just for scientists but for office workers, farmers, teachers, doctors, librarians, almost everyone ... Paragraphs indented for emphasis visual appeal

... a world in which many of the most interesting, most challenging career opportunities call for a background in science and technology.

That's why I'm pleased that my children read 3-2-1 CONTACT, a magazine for 3rd through 8th graders that does for them what <u>Sesame Street</u> does for younger children: It educates without tears, using cartoons, games, jokes, and the attention-getting tricks of television to stimulate, enrich, and enlighten.

3-2-1 CONTACT is published by the non-profit Children's Television Workshop. It is a glossy, colorful magazine, loosely based on the television show of the same name. Like the show, the magazine has high production values: lively graphics, good writing, clear, full-color photographs and amusing illustrations throughout. Issue after issue, your youngsters will be entertained and challenged by such features as ...

EXTRA! The puzzles-and-games pages of the magazine, and the section most readers turn to first. Perhaps there'll be a "what's wrong with this picture" game, designed to promote logic and attention to detail. Sometimes there's a maze to get through, or a simple hands-on experiment, or a word-search puzzle.

There's often something to write away for -- for example, a free booklet from Kodak on how to make a pin-hole camera. Sometimes there's a riddle your child can solve by doing a series of math problems. (Can you imagine? Fun math!)

TNT: Tomorrow's News Today -- is a popular monthly column that brings our readers interesting news, often before their parents know of it. Have you heard about pop rice? (It tastes like pop corn, but is made from rice.) Did you know that the planet Pluto is a lot smaller than previously thought, and may be downgraded to a "minor planet"? Have

you heard about the plans for a two-mile-long elevated freeway in Los Angeles -- for bicycles only? Do you know about the new aerosol spray that protects against poison ivy? 3-2-1 CONTACT readers know about all these, and more!

The famous magician Blackstone is a contributor to 3-2-1 CONTACT, usually with a remarkable math trick, such as this one:

Using a calculator, punch in any three-digit number. (Example: 627.) Then punch it in again, so you have a six-digit number. (Example: 627,627.) Then divide the six-digit number by seven, divide the answer by 11, and divide that answer by 13. Amazingly, you'll always end up with the original three-digit number! Try it!

THE TIME TEAM is another popular feature of 3-2-1 CONTACT. In each month's story, two teenagers -- with the help of a science fair project gone awry -- travel into the past or the future. Transported to different eras and cultures, the heroes become caught up in exciting historical moments, and have adventures with people both famous and ordinary. In another, they find themselves in the middle of the Civil War. An entertaining blend of fact and fiction, the stories make history and science come alive!

<u>FACTOIDS</u>, too, is a popular monthly column, one that provides our readers with curious little facts which they can share with their friends. For example, did you know that ...

- * In one day, Americans eat enough pizza to cover 75 football fields.
- * A codfish lays up to four million eggs at one time, but on average only two will become fish.
- * Lions sleep about 18 hours a day.
- * One hundred years ago, the average 9-year-old was about six inches shorter than a 9-year-old today.
- * In one year, your heart beats about 36,000,000 times.

And of course, every issue of 3-2-1 CONTACT contains several major articles spanning the depth and breadth of science today. For example, recently we had a special issue on <u>Water</u>, with articles on Rescuing a Coral Reef ... River Rafting Catches On ... and Are We Running Out of Water?
