There will be prizes for artwork! \$75 for first place, \$50 for second place, and \$25 for third place.

Collaborative and site-specific work is encouraged.

Art work must be able to withstand the elements for the entire week.

The garden is open to the public. Your work will not be insured. Your artwork must remain installed for the duration of the exhibition and should withstand the elements.

To participate in a *Wish Tree inspired* by Yoko Ono, drop off offering to Clarkston art department office, CF building by April 12. These can be paper, no larger than 5" x 7."
